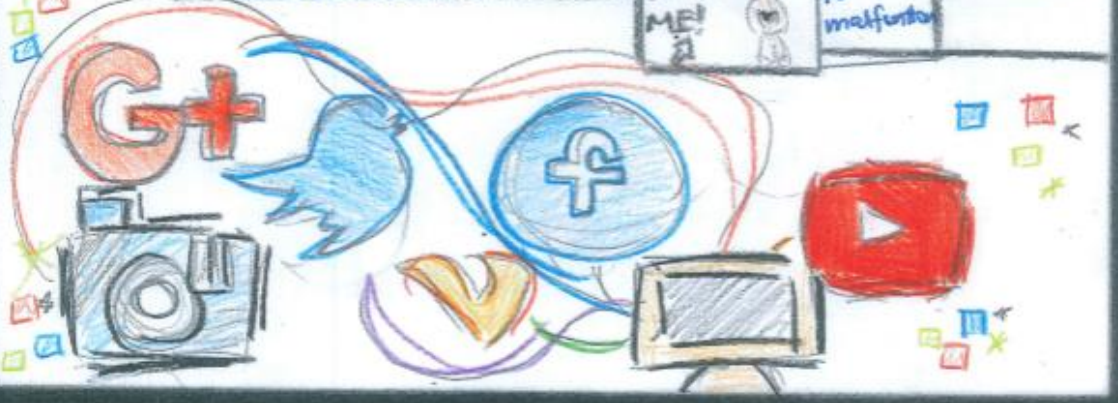
Don't Meet up - Step 2

1. Don't expose any personal information like where you live, your name, your age, your phone number or even your email address.
2. Don't accept any friend requests from people you don't know.

3. Be careful when accepting friend requests, people could pretend to be someone you know.

How to be Safe Online!

The internet is great fun but it does have dangers and we want you to be safe online.

People can pretend to be your age and unfortunately there have been cases where adults have pretended to be teenagers and lured young people into meeting them in dangerous situations.

Never give out your personal information

Be careful what you download

Choose strong passwords

Be careful what you post

Be careful who you meet online.

Tell a trusted adult if you don't feel safe online.



E-Safety

To stay safe on the internet, you need to follow many simple rules that help you feel comfortable while scrolling through the web. Here are the main ones:

1. Firstly, if anyone unknown sends a follow request or direct message, do not respond or accept.
2. Secondly, whenever someone posts anything mean or untrue about you, report it to a trusted adult.
3. Thirdly, never post anything personal (a picture of yourself, a picture of someone else etc.)
4. Finally, whatever you do, do not share personal information (Address, phone number, school etc.)

Those are, in my opinion, the four most important rules to stay safe online.



BEING E-SAFE

1: YOUR info,

Do not share personal information when online. If anyone asks, NEVER respond. They aren't what you think they are.

3: Virus?

Any file could be a virus.

Always make sure before opening. Use a defender to scan it, etc.

2: Meetings,

If anyone wants to meet you, say no. They can be dangerous.

Meme - Someone or something can be made fun of as a video or picture.

Viral - A picture or video that gains a lot of popularity.

5: Block, or CEOP,

Block or report them by clicking report then either explain or click the category of what they have done.

4: Trust,

Tell a trusted person. When you feel something is bothering you online. Maybe it's about you.

Virus - A code/software which injects your device and can destroy it.

Adware - Same as a virus but instead pops un-checked adverts to the screen.

WHAT YOU MUST DO

* Do NOT give your personal details such as your address and phone number.

* It's very important not to answer any questions from strangers in the internet, or online games whether they want to meet you in person.

* Remember DON'T add them as your friend, if you don't know them online.

If YOU don't feel comfortable about your situation that you got into you must do this: report to a trusted adult like your teacher, your parents and they'll fix the problem.
