Reading Fluency

- Please help you child by ensuring that they read for at least 20 minutes each night and sign their reading diary on a daily basis.
- In order for the children to gain the most out of reading, ask them comprehension questions about the text they are reading, check their understanding and help them to develop a love of reading.
- SATS Reading- Pupils need to be able to read fluently, and analyze the text with a deeper understanding of vocabulary (Root words, antonyms, synonyms and additional language features)

Reading Fluency

For 10- to 11-year-olds, an average reading speed is between 139-194 words per minute. To improve fluency, they should continue to read regularly, engage in choral reading and echo reading, and have their comprehension checked through questions after silent reading to ensure they are not just reading quickly but also understanding the material.

Give/explain the meaning of words in context;

Retrieve and record information/ identify key details from fiction and non-fiction;

Summarise main ideas from more than one paragraph;

Make inferences from the text/ explain and justify inferences with evidence from the text;

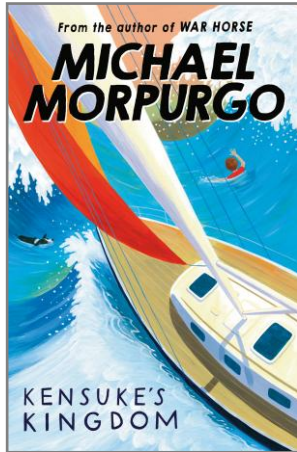
Predict what might happen from details stated and implied;

Identify/ explain how information/ narrative content is related and contributes to meaning as a whole;

Identify/explain how meaning is enhanced through choice of words and phrases;

Make comparisons within the text.

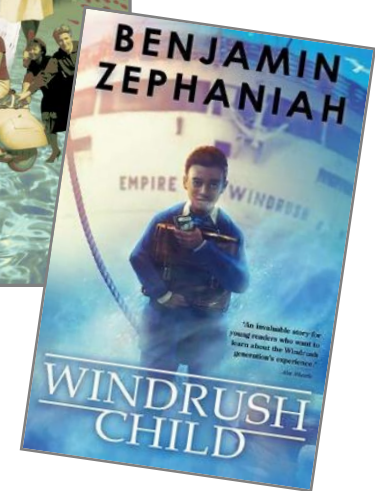
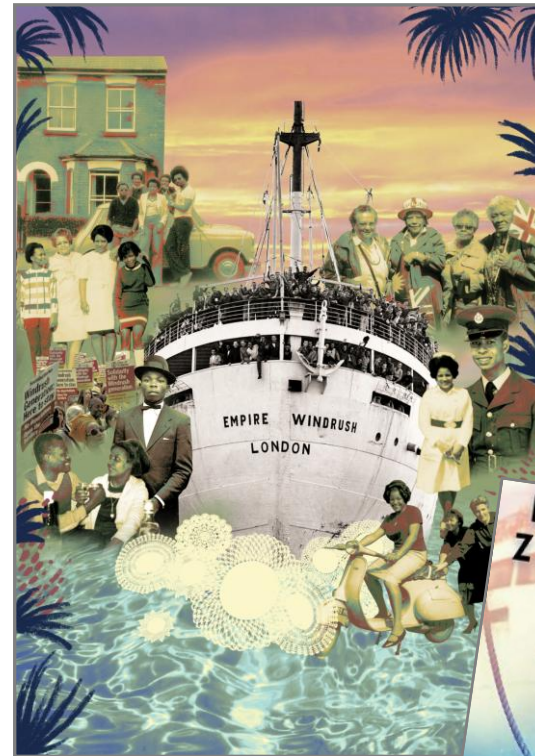


Skills:

Science Curriculum Overview

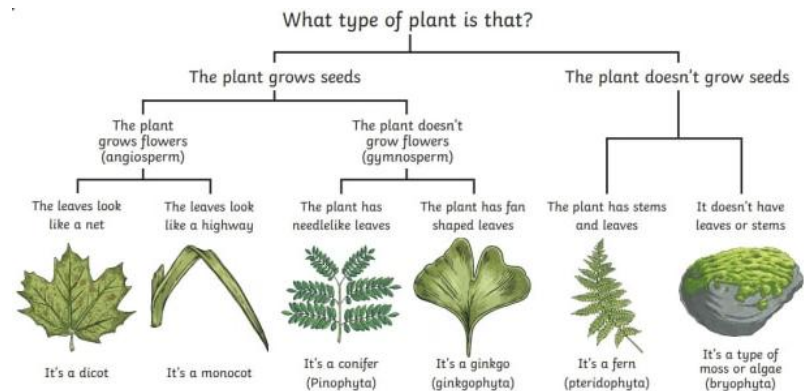

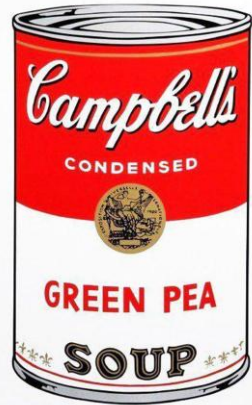
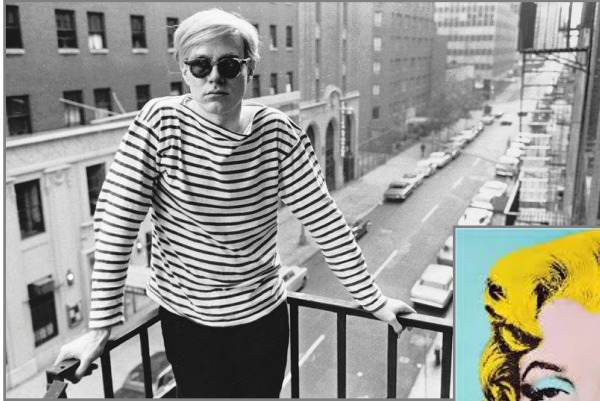
Classification

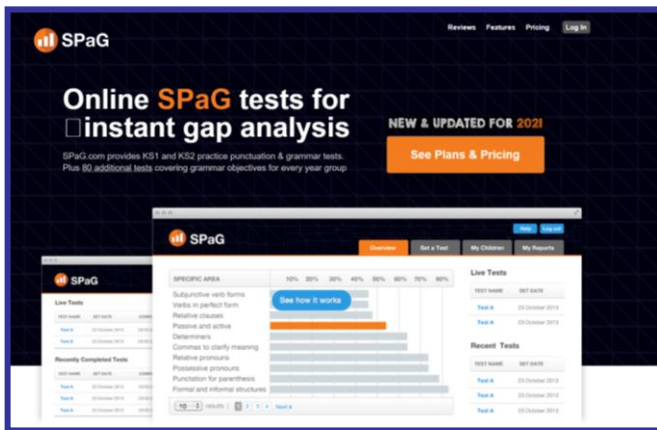
